

Safe Operating Procedures Garden Hand Tools.

This range of hand tools will usually include the following:

- Hand pruning saw for cutting branches.
- Shovel / Spade.
- Secateurs.
- Weeding Trowel.
- Mulch Fork.
- Garden Clippers.
- Rake.
- Hoe.

OPERATIONAL SAFETY CHECKS – Hand Pruning Saw

- Inspect the condition of the saw teeth.
- When using saw apply pressure on the pulling stroke. Avoid excessive effort as this may cause the blade to jam.
- Take care to protect the sharp, exposed teeth of any hand saw blade and hole saws.
- Hold hand on branch more than 20cm from the cut as the saw can jump and cause hand injury.
- Do not cut a branch with a hand pruning saw greater than 25mm diameter.
- Wear suitable PPE including gloves and safety boots.
- Spray the blade with lubricant spray after use.

OPERATIONAL SAFETY CHECKS - Shovel / Spade

- Inspect the condition of the shovel / Spade prior to use. Report any issues.
- When lifting soil. Avoid pivoting the lower back.
- Hold the shaft of the shovel / spade lower down closer to the blade.
- Use the foot to launch the blade into the soil prior to lifting.
- Use a wheelbarrow to transport soil.
- Wear suitable PPE including gloves and safety boots.
- Take regular breaks and alternate work with other colleagues when using shovel.

OPERATIONAL SAFETY CHECKS – Secateurs

- Inspect the condition of the secateurs prior to use. Report any issues.
- Store the secateurs in the holster around your waste when not in use.
- Do not cut a branch greater than 20mm diameter.
- Wear suitable PPE including gloves and safety boots.
- Spray secateurs with a suitable lubricant spray after use.

OPERATIONAL SAFETY CHECKS – Weeding Trowel

- Inspect the condition of the weeding trowel prior to use. Report any issues.
- Do not use in the vicinity of irrigation pipes.
- Wear suitable PPE including gloves, eyewear and safety boots.

OPERATIONAL SAFETY CHECKS – Mulch Fork

- Inspect the condition of the mulch fork prior to use. Report any issues.
- When lifting mulch. Avoid pivoting the lower back.
- Hold the shaft of the fork lower down closer to the blade.
- Use a wheelbarrow / garbage bin to transport mulch. Don't overfill the barrow or bin.
- Wear suitable PPE including gloves, eyewear and safety boots.

OPERATIONAL SAFETY CHECKS – Clippers

- Inspect the condition of the Clippers prior to use including blade sharpness. Report any issues.
- Trim greenery and don't place hands in the path of the blade.
- Wear suitable PPE including gloves, eyewear and safety boots.

OPERATIONAL SAFETY CHECKS – Rake

- Inspect the condition of the rake prior to use. Report any issues.
- When using the rake. Avoid pivoting the lower back.
- When raking top soil hold the rake close to the body and avoid over stretching
- Wear suitable PPE including gloves, eyewear and safety boots.

OPERATIONAL SAFETY CHECKS – Hoe

- Inspect the condition of the hoe prior to use. Report any issues.
- When using the rake extend front leg to hoe.
- Wear suitable PPE including gloves, eyewear and safety boots.

HOUSEKEEPING

- 1. Leave the work area in a safe, clean and tidy condition.
- 2. Wipe all Garden Hand Tools clean, and return them to their appropriate storage rack in the trailer.
- 3. Regularly maintain the condition of garden hand tools.
